Home learning folders - In Hazel Class your child will have a home learning folder which we will put their home learning in each Friday to be returned to school on the following Thursday. There will be spellings and key skills such as grammar and punctuation activities, along with a maths activity. We also recommend 20 minutes reading each day - please record home reading in the yellow reading record so that we can reward children for their efforts. In addition to this we will give you details of our project at the beginning of each half term which may be linked to Science, Art, History or Geography for example.

PE kits - please make sure that the children bring their PE kit to school and keep it at school on their peg in a drawstring type PE bag.

Assemblies - Praise assembly will be on FRIDAYS at the church for the next half term, to which you are warmly invited. It will start at 2.50pm and the children will return to school to collect their belongings afterwards.

Snacks - Fruit snacks are encouraged at morning break time for Hazel class. Please - no unhealthy snacks such as biscuits, crisps, cake etc.

Finally, don't forget to bring a water bottle every day and wear outer clothing appropriate to the weather. A coat is useful every day even if the weather seems fine first thing as we will try to have some outdoor time in all but the worst weather.
